

RUN 'EM TWICE POKER



RUN'EM TWICE Poker, a unique five-card poker game that lets players engage in two poker hands in one game. It's just you against a pay table and not the dealer or other players. RUN'EM TWICE Poker offers the optional 5-Card Bonus, and the Ultimate Pairs wager

HOW TO PLAY

Place equal wagers on both the "1st Ante," and "2nd Ante" bet spots. You may also place a bet on the 5-Card Bonus and ULTIMATE PAIRS wagers. The dealer will position five community cards face down on the layout and give each player their two-card hand face down.

DECISION TIME

After looking at your two-card hand the decision is yours: you can bet 1x to 3x your 1st Ante wager on the "1st Run" bet spot or fold.

The dealer will reveal the two cards associated with the 1st Ante. You now have an option to place a wager of 1x to 3x your 2nd Ante on the "2nd Run" bet spot or fold.

The dealer will reveal the two cards associated with the 2nd Ante. Your final decision is to place a wager of 1x to 3x on the Center spot or fold.

Note: If you fold, you will forfeit any base game wagers made to that point. The 5 Card Bonus and Ultimate Pair (if played) remain in action.

FIVE CARD BONUS

The 5-Card Bonus is an optional wager that must be placed before any cards are dealt and is resolved regardless of whether the player folds on the main wagers. The wager wins if the five community cards form a Poker hand that is a pair of Sixes or better, otherwise the wager is lost. The 5-Card Bonus wager is paid according to the pay table below:

HAND	PAYS
Royal Flush	250 to 1
Straight Flush	100 to 1
Four of a Kind	40 to 1
Full House	15 to 1
Flush	10 to 1
Straight	6 to 1
Three of a Kind	4 to 1
Two Pair	3 to 1
Sixes or better	1 to 1

ULTIMATE PAIRS

The Ultimate Pairs wager is an optional wager that must be placed before any cards are dealt and is resolved regardless of whether the player folds on the main wagers. The wager wins if the player's two cards are a pair or a mixture of an Ace and a face card, otherwise the wager is lost. The Ultimate Pairs wager is paid according to the pay table below.

Players Hand	Odds
Ace Hearts/Ace Diamonds	100 to 1
Pair of Aces	30 to 1
Ace-Face Suited	20 to 1
Ace-Face Non-Suited	10 to 1
Pair (2's-King's)	4-1

FIVE CARD PROGRESSIVE

This Progressive is linked to your favorite Poker games: Three Card Poker, Mississippi Stud and Ultimate Texas Hold'em. And, this Progressive is linked with all other Hollywood Casino properties across Pennsylvania.

In Run 'em Twice Poker, the Progressive is a \$5 bet placed before the hand is dealt and is formed from the player's two cards, the first two flop cards (horizontal) , and the center card. Below is the pay table for the progressive bet. If you bet on the Progressive and another player hits one of the Top 2 Hands, you will receive an Envy Bonus.

HAND	PAYS	ENVY
Royal Flush	100% of the Progressive Jackpot	\$5,000
Straight Flush	10% of the Progressive Jackpot	\$1,500
Four-of-a-Kind	\$1,500	-
Full House	\$250	-
Flush	\$200	-
Straight	\$150	-
Three-of-a-Kind	\$45	-

Original wager is not returned. Folded hands are eligible for the Five Card Progressive Payout and the Envy Bonus payout. \$50,000 maximum aggregate payout per player per hand applies to ante wagers. This does not apply to the Five Card Bonus wager as well.

MUST-HIT-BY MYSTERY BONUS

If you make a Progressive wager, you will have a chance to win the Must-Hit-By Mystery. When a player's progressive wager increases the Must-Hit-By Mystery progressive meter's jackpot amount more than a random dollar value pre-selected by an electronic random number generator, between \$250 and \$1,000, the player wins the Bonus.
